Enrique Alemán, Jr., Ph.D., is the Executive Producer and Co-Writer of *Stolen Education*, a documentary about the forgotten history of a little-known court case from the 1950s, *Hernandez et al. v. Driscoll Consolidated School District*. In 1956 eight elementary students testified in a federal desegregation court case. As Mexican Americans, they were placed in three years of first grade as a way to discriminate against them by the all White school board, administration and faculty. *Stolen Education* documents the journey to recapture the remarkable story of the schoolchildren who changed educational history in Texas and confronts the continued inequity in public schools today.
