



Chancellor **Gary S. May** University of California, Davis

► Gary S. May is the seventh chancellor of UC Davis, one of the nation's most academically and socially diverse universities. He is leading the university to new heights in academic excellence, enterprise research, public service and upward mobility for students of all backgrounds.

Chancellor May came to UC Davis in 2017 after serving as dean of Georgia Tech's College of Engineering, the nation's largest and most diverse school of its kind. May has won numerous awards for his research in computer-aided manufacturing of integrated circuits. In 2010, he was named "outstanding engineering alumnus" of UC Berkeley, where he earned his master's and Ph.D. degrees in electrical engineering and computer science.

In 2015, President Obama honored him with the Presidential Award for Excellence in STEM Mentoring. In 2021, he received the prestigious Lifetime Mentor Award from the American Association for the Advancement of Science for demonstrating extraordinary leadership to increase the participation of underrepresented groups in the fields of science and engineering. May was inducted to the National Academy of Engineering in September 2018 and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in April 2020.

► Andrea Flores is an Emmy-nominated journalist who anchors the KCRA 3 News at 10 p.m.

She is a proud alumna from the University of California, Davis where she graduated with a degree in communication and Spanish.

The youngest son of Socorro and Paul Chávez, César Chávez's middle son, Andres was born and raised in the farm worker movement at its La Paz headquarters,

graduated magna cum laude from California State University, Bakersfield in 2016, with a B.A. degree in Public Policy and Administration, and has spent most of his life with the movement. He has also served in Central Valley political campaigns and set up programs through California State University, Sacramento helping farm workers earn their GED degrees.



Lina Méndez

► Dr. Lina Méndez is the inaugural director of the Hispanic Serving Institution Initiative within the Office of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion at UC Davis. She is a proud alumna of UC Davis, and she currently oversees the César Chávez Youth Leadership Conference. Her research and publications focus on

higher education access, retention, persistence, English learners, faculty tenure, and community based participatory research. Dr. Méndez has 20 years of experience working at UC Davis and is passionate about serving and mentoring the next generation of rising scholars.



Renetta Garrison Tull

► Dr. Renetta Garrison Tull is Vice Chancellor for Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion at the University of California, Davis. The office supports UC Davis's Hispanic Serving Institutions initiative, Anchor Institutions Mission, Principles of Community, and employee resources groups. Tull earned engineering and science degrees from Howard University and Northwestern University, was an Anna Julia Cooper Postdoctoral Fellow at the

University of Wisconsin-Madison and has held faculty positions at the UW-Madison, and the University of Maryland College Park. Tull has been involved with projects for Puerto Rico's ADVANCE Hispanic Women in STEM, the Latin and Caribbean Consortium of Engineering Institutions, the National Academies of Science, Engineering, and Medicine, UNESCO and the Student Platform for Engineering Education Development Global Mentoring Award.

► Dr. Luis Carvajal-Carmona is the Associate Vice Chancellor for Academic Diversity and a Professor of Biochemistry and Molecular Medicine at the University of California at Davis (UCD). Dr. Carvajal-Carmona specializes in cancer genetics, epidemiology, health disparities, and global health. He serves as the Center for Advancing Cancer Health Director Nationally. Dr. Carvajal-Carmona has served as a member of the American Association for Cancer Research (AACR) Minorities in Cancer Research Council, the AACR Minority Scholars Awards Committee and the AACR Racial Inequities Task Force amongst other organizations.

He was the first person from his family to attend college. Dr. Carvajal-Carmona has mentored dozens of undergraduate and graduate students, 95 % of whom have been first-generation college graduates and members of underrepresented groups. His mentees have been awarded 50+ fellowships and research awards and are all currently pursuing higher education or are employed at leading institutions and companies. He has been awarded the UCD Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Mentoring Undergraduate Research and the UCD ADVANCE Scholar Award for outstanding scholarship and mentorship.

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
